

New Phonics and Spelling Rules

Words contain a mixture of vowels (*voyelles*) and consonants (*consonnes*)

The letter y is called *igrec*

Some French words have double consonants: *mm* in *une gomme*

This accent: *É é* (*café / pré*) is called an **acute accent**. This accent: *È è* (*règle*) is called a **grave accent**.

e / eu :
le / rouge

noir / trois


New Conversational Phrases



New Grammar Points and Sentence Structures

Nouns in French have a **gender: masculine nouns and feminine nouns**. We use '**un**' to introduce masculine nouns and '**une**' to introduce feminine nouns.

We can use a comma and a conjunction to list 3 or more nouns in a sentence eg
Voici un feutre, un pinceau et un crayon.
