


New Phonics and Spelling Rules



œ is known as a **ligature**.

We have liaison: **des œufs**. We don't pronounce the 'f' or 's' in œufs

When a noun starts with a vowel, we use an apostrophe to replace the 'e' in 'de' and 'le' – this is called elision. Eg:


un avion	l'avion	d'avions	Combien d'avions y a-t-il ?



New Grammar Points

In French, there are 3 words for the **possessive pronoun** 'my': **mon** – for masculine nouns; **ma** – for feminine nouns ; **mes** – for plural nouns



Adjectival agreement: adjectives need to add an 's' if they are describing a plural noun.
