





### New Phonics and Spelling Rules

<p>The letter <b>g</b> is hard when it comes before the vowels <b>a / o / u</b>: <b>gare / guitare / dragon</b></p> 	<p>The letter <b>g</b> is soft when it comes before the letters <b>e, i, y</b>: <b>girafe / genou / rouge</b></p> 	<p>The digraphs <b>'an', 'en', 'am'</b> and <b>'em'</b> all make the same nasal sound: <b>France / encore / jambe / décembre</b></p> 	<p>The nasal sounds <b>'in'</b> and <b>'im'</b>: <b>cinq / important</b></p> 
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The **determiners les, des, mes, tes and ses** all indicate the **plural**. The letters **es** in these words are pronounced **é**. The final **s** is silent.



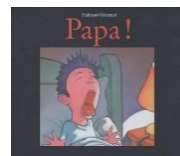
